Complete the plant adaptations interactive google slides on google classroom. Complete the adaptations/behavior interactive google slides on google classroom.
Social Studies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Literacy Pro: Read <u>The American Revolution</u> and take the quiz following your reading. Tumblebooks: watch a history video about Christopher Columbus and email your teacher 3-4 facts you learned. Go to the Ducksters.com website. Click on American Revolution. Read the article. Pick an event from the Revolution at the bottom. Write a summary about the event and share it with your teacher. Follow the link in google classroom to brainpop (you may have to create a family account). Click the "Social Studies" tab, then "US history". Under this tab there are several topics. Choose one (or multiple) related to the American Revolution or 13 colonies, watch the video, and take the quiz.
